


Economic backdrop

- Alberta's economy bucking the trend this year
 - Economy showing some momentum
 - Energy sector and residential construction leading the way
- Risks to the outlook are rising
 - Rising protectionism and geopolitical tensions pose risks to outlook
 - · Heightened uncertainty and demand concerns weighing on oil prices
 - Slowing momentum in labour market might be a challenge heading into next year.
 - Lower interest rates should provide some support to growth in 2025



Threat of U.S. tariffs clouding global and Canadian economic outlook




Diverging interest rates a drag on the Loonie


Canadian dollar exchange rates





Year-to-date growth in Alberta Activity Index by components, September 2024




Oil production ramping up amid volatility in prices

Oil Prices





Alberta's total oil production




Non-energy business output slow to pick up

Alberta's non-energy merchandise exports by category, YTD change (Sept 24)




Industrial building sector leading the way

Non-residential building investment by type



Annual level of business investment


Annual change in business investment





Annual change in population, historical and forecast*




Annual change in the Alberta population by migration component*




Housing activity booming amid strong demand and low inventories


Existing home sales, units under construction and housing starts


Residential activity to remain strong

Real residential construction forecast




Underlying inflationary pressures easing

Number of CPI components by annual price growth






Consumer and small business confidence moving up

Alberta Business Barometer Index







Job vacancy and job finding rate, 3-month moving average




Construction labour market tighter than rest

Unemployed per vacant position





Contribution to the unemployment rate




Unadjusted 3-mth MA* of unemployment rates by immigrant status, aged 24 to 54


Youth part rate converges to national average

Labour market indicators




Consumers pulling back on discretionary spending


Alberta new vehicle sales by month (NSA)




GDP per capita falling behind despite solid headline growth
